This story highlights how kids in our care have experienced togetherness and how it has lifted them up during difficult times. We want our ministry partners to know the power of togetherness. Your support is like that of Aaron and Hur when Moses could not deliver the Israelites on his own.

We work and stand together so that children and families placed in our care can see what it means to live in a family. We want kids to see a better story. That is what working together does. It shows those around us the context for a better story for their life — A life full of the love, grace, and truth found only in God!

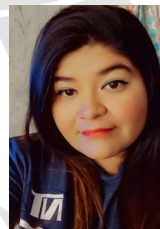
Welcome to team ministry
